Future hope is to drive a recreation and sport build using current open space which could then be utilised out of school hours by the community (like the hockey area).

11.0 BUSINESS ARISING

Sports at Shenton - presentation by Eric & Sam (PE teachers). Shenton College was the 11.1 number 1 participant of all government schools last year. Only beaten by specialist sports schools. PE teachers have historically done afterschool sport however this has changed due to education department restrictions. Teaching load is high for teachers and capacity is difficult to be able to provide extra sports. 24 sports catered to last year. Size of school cohorts can make capacity to cater for all students difficult. A lot of opportunities offered to students given and they are advertised extensively to attract students. VET students have curriculum requirements and they are engaged to help run the sport events. Parent help is difficult to coordinate as there is the need to have a staff member there as well which can become a financial, time and supervision issue. Facilitating parental help can be time consuming for teachers due to coordination of having teaching load and large school numbers. Need for communication to parent body regarding capacity of PE teachers to provide extra sports for the students. Management of volunteers can be difficult and needs to be looked at do better. PE teachers are very passionate about their positions and their role at Shenton. Possible action is to provide information regarding sport at Shenton to new students and parents coming to Shenton. Many thanks to Eric & Sam for taking the time to come to the P&C meeting and explaining about the Shenton PE department, parents at the meeting have benefitted greatly from developing a better understanding of the department and the way that it runs.

Some extra work is required to complete the project (water meter that P&C could potentially take over from the Water Corp to maintain water saving recording). LED light project is on track to complete as well. Need to develop more members and advertising for those members of fathers/mothers. Interest is sought from the wider parent community to develop the following for the Fathering Project. Need to capture the year 7s coming into school who may have had some historical understanding of the Fathering Project.
- 11.2 FOMS concert for fundraising for Hawaiian music trip. FOMS have funded wristbands for tour, music sheets, recorders and keyboard have been funded as well. Future funding music books for Wind 1 ensemble, drum and double base stools and music tour photo album for the touring students. Funds available for the end of the year and looking at what the music group needs (bank accounts being considered so that they can gain interest on the money in bank). This year is the Quiz night year (August 2017). Money for FOMS comes from concerts, donations, Quiz Night, coffee and tea. Possible action to improve ability to communication from FOMS (communication emails, Facebook page). P&C recognition of how hard PE teachers (and all teachers at Shenton) work at providing sport to students at Shenton. Discussion around ability for students to perform as a whole which is difficult at Shenton due to limited space auditorium.
