GENERAL INFORMATION

A parent or legal guardian applying to enrol a child in a government school should complete an Application for Enrolment form. Family details should include details of parents, guardians or carers residing at the same address as the student being enrolled. Only permanent residents of Australia and those children holding an approved visa sub-class number are eligible to be enrolled in a government school. Only students under the age of eighteen years of age can be enrolled and must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Out of area enrolments may be accepted when places are available.

It is a requirement of the Department of Education that any information on suspensions and exclusions must be provided to the school at the time of applying to enrol a child. This information will help the college to provide your child with the appropriate support, if required.

The Principal of the school may cancel the enrolment of an enrolled student if the Principal is satisfied that:

- the enrolment was obtained by the giving of false or misleading information; or
- the Principal has not been advised of changes to the following:
 - usual place of residence
 - court orders pertaining to the child
 - details of any conditions of the child that may call for special steps to be taken for the benefit or protection of the enrollee or other persons in the school
 - legal guardianship of the child

RESIDENT IN LOCAL INTAKE AREA

Shenton College is a local intake school. The boundaries are determined by the Department of Education of Western Australia. A map of this area is available should you need to know these boundaries on the **school website**. An eligible child whose place of residence is within the local intake area is guaranteed enrolment (subject to provision of required documentation).

If your child has gained enrolment from outside the local intake area into a specialist program, their siblings will not be guaranteed enrolment in the school.

An older sibling who is currently enrolled in the College, and resides outside of our local intake area, does not guarantee a place in the College for a younger sibling.

SECURITY AND CONFIDENTIALITY

The information provided on these enrolment forms will be stored securely in local school and Departmental databases. The management of these databases is governed by State and Departmental policies to ensure security, privacy and confidentiality.

The Department of Education's Information Privacy and Security policy preclude this information from being used for any purpose other than to:

- determine whether your application for enrolment can be accepted;
- assist the school with addressing any needs for your child if enrolment is accepted; and
- comply with legal requirements or ministerial directions.

LOCAL INTAKE AREA CHANGES

Local intake areas for four schools have been amended to create a local intake area for the new Inner City College.

The local intake area for Inner City College was published in the Western Australian Government Gazette on 27 June 2017, along with amended local intake areas for:

- Churchlands Senior High School
- Dianella Secondary College
- Mount Lawley Senior High School
- Shenton College

The new local intake areas will take effect from the 2020 school year.

ENROLMENT ENTITLEMENT

Families with children who, as at 27 June 2017:

- reside at an address within a secondary school local intake area that is subject to change; and
- still reside at that address in or after 2020

will maintain the enrolment entitlement they had as at 27 June 2017, and will be eligible to take up their new entitlement, which may include entitlement to attend Inner City College.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Families who move to a new address after the gazettal date of 27 June 2017 will be subject to the new local intake areas that come into effect upon the opening of Inner City College from 2020.

For families with a child already attending a secondary school and a sibling commencing secondary school in or after 2020, the younger sibling will not have the same enrolment entitlement as their older sibling and will be subject to the new local intake areas.

These families can still apply to enrol their younger sibling at a school where their older sibling attends, however their application will be considered in line with the priority order outlined in the Enrolment policy.

All families retain the right to apply to enrol their children at any public school. Applications received from outside the local intake area will continue to be considered by the school based on the priority order outlined in the Enrolment in Public Schools Policy.
