Available to Year 11 students.

This qualification reflects the role of individuals working in varied contexts in the dance teaching industry, providing aid and support to teachers and students under supervision. Individuals are expected to use some discretion and judgement and relevant theoretical knowledge to assist in instructing, managing, and planning classroom activities. The job roles that relate to this qualification may include assistant dance teacher for 5 to 10 year old children.

Students will be required to assist dance teachers in classes both at school and externally through their Dance School. Students will refine their dance techniques in commercial and contemporary genres; develop music ideas and listening skills that will be applied to the role and expectations of assistant dance teachers. This will be achieved through studying teaching theory, behavioural psychology, ethical instruction, anatomy and nutrition, dance composition and analysis skills. Students require technical proficiency in at least one genre and a basic awareness of a second. An appropriate level of physical fitness and an ability to retain and sequence movement material is desirable.

It applies to work in different work environments that include entertainment customer service, staging, television and radio production, broadcasting production, lighting and sound, theatre, scenery and set construction, screen and media, and film production. Individuals complete tasks with limited complexity and with required actions clearly defined. Job roles that relate to this qualification may include Venue Attendant, Usher, Production Assistant (Film and Television), Junior Production Crew, Trainee Production Crew, Radio Production Assistant, Program Seller, Merchandise Seller, Stagehand, Runner, Dresser, Crewing Employee, Sound Assistant, Bump in/Bump out Loader, Wardrobe Assistant. Students will gain practical experience in staging events while working as part of a team and being creative.

CUA31120 Certificate III in Visual Arts

Available to 12 students who have completed the Certificate II in Visual Arts.

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who are developing a range of visual art skills and who may take responsibility for own outputs in work and learning. It applies to work in different visual arts, craft and design environments. Practice at this level is underpinned by the application of introductory art theory and history. Individuals may work under direction, using some discretion and judgment, and may provide support to a team. They may also work autonomously on familiar tasks within defined work settings.

This qualification provides an in-depth knowledge of deaf protocol and will develop skills to adjust signing styles to suit a specified audience, including the skills needed to use Auslan in a range of unpredictable, more challenging tasks such as specialised workplace exchanges in personal, learning, social and community contexts. Students will also gain a thorough knowledge of deaf culture and customs and have the opportunity to gain employment in a role requiring Auslan qualifications.

SIT20122 Certificate II in Tourism

Individuals with this qualification use a defined and limited range of basic coaching skills to engage participants in a specific sport and are involved in mainly routine and repetitive tasks using limited practical skills and basic sport industry knowledge. They work under the supervision of a coach. Possible job role titles depend on the specific sport may include assistant coach.
