Post School Pathways

Shenton are sending 3 staff and 1 alumni student to Adelaide in August to attend a conference that will be focussing on micro credentialing. The alumni student we are taking was embedded in the alternate programs that were used in the VET space. She will be a strong voice in this space. There is a national conversation around ATAR and pathways into university.

Anything that allows you to recognise the individual student and not just have them seen as a student number is crucial to Shenton.

At Shenton we are large enough to be both types of schools - both ATAR and VET. We have a long culture now in providing substantial certificate courses.

Shenton are intending to recruit a Career Practitioner in 2024.
